EVENTS & NETWORKING

Networking opportunities are a key ingredient of member involvement and although our 2021 State Convention was postponed due to the on-going pandemic, we hit record attendance numbers at our other events in 2021! In late January, AGC hosted our 4th Annual John Shoemaker Ice Fishing Tournament. The event raised over \$6,000 for our Annual Scholarship Program.

AGC successfully hosted our Spring and Fall Membership Meetings in Rapid City and Sioux Falls. In addition, we hosted our Summer Fishing Tournament, two Golf Tournaments and two Summer Socials. All of our Summer events hit RECORD attendance numbers. with over 600 members attending a summer event. All of these events combined raised over \$30,000 for our Annual Scholarship Program!

AGC rolled out an all new Membership Benefit in 2021: Enova!

Members have started utilizing this new benefit by participating in a FREE HR Healthcheck, a FREE state-wide jobs board and training webinars!





SAFETY & TRAINING

The AGC Safety Services Team offered Safety and Leadership training to 1,212 participants throughout the state in 2021! Seven different leadership offerings accounted for 19 sessions with 177 attendees. Twenty-three different Safety classes accounted for 120 sessions with 1,035 attendees.

To get ahead of the February 7th newly mandated Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) requirements, the AGC worked diligently to roll-out an all new CDL training program to members in 2021. With the addition of a new contract trainer focused solely on CDL training, AGC is now a registered provider in the National Training Provider Registry (TPR) system. Trainings that are offered include; a 3-Day Theory Training class, Range Training and Behind the Wheel Training. These new offerings allow AGC members the benefit of training new and current employees. All CDL trainings are offered to meet the new ELDT standards.

The AGC Safety Committee was active in 2021 hosting meetings bi-monthly across the state. Topics of discussion at these meetings included: AGC's Annual Training Calendar, trench safety, fall hazard prevention, OSHA updates, and professional development opportunities. The purpose of the AGC Safety Committee is to bring together safety professionals from member companies across the state to discuss areas of concern and provide a sounding board for safety related issues.



In 2021, AGC Safety Trainer, Jim Heaphy, completed all requirements to obtain a Board of Certified Safety Professionals (BCSP) certification. This highly respected certification is awarded

by BCSP to individuals who meet eligibility and experience criteria in safety, health and environmental discipline and have passed rigorous examination. Congratulations Jim!

AGC's MSHA Alliance was active in 2021 hosting meetings quarterly across the state. Topics of discussion at these meetings included; AGC's Annual Training Calendar,

Powered Haulage, Significant & Substantial (S&S) Violations, and MSHA realignment of jurisdictions. The purpose of the MSHA Alliance is to promote mine safety and health by combining the unique respective talents, efforts and resources of the membership, facilitating the exchange of information and providing a unified voice for the industry.

Members of the West River Safety Committee held an October Trench Safety Stand Down with over 125 individuals attending to bring attention to the importance of trenching and excavation safety in response to 3 incidents involving unsafe excavation practices in Western South Dakota.

2021 Safety Tidbits

OSHA 10hr. for Construction was the most attended Safety class in 2021! There were 143 attendees in 16 classes from 21 different companies!

Did You Know?

Traffic Control Supervisor was the most popular Leadership class conducted in 2021! There were 96 attendees in 4 classes from 24 different companies!

Forklift Operator was the most requested class of 2021. It was requested 18 times with 117 attendees from 19 different companies!



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

AGC was one of three organizations that received a \$50,000 grant from the Department of Labor in 2021. The grant's intent was to enroll students ages 16 and 17 in AGC's Heavy Equipment Operator (HEO) and Carpentry Apprentice programs. We successfully enrolled 14 students into the program and added new technology that allowed us to provide training statewide. The grant will wrap up in spring of 2022.

In 2021, AGC was awarded a SDDOT training grant to develop a CDL training program for our members. The grant addresses a new rule set by the FMCSA requiring formal training for entry level drivers, and drivers looking to up-skill their current CDL. A marketing campaign consisting of television, radio and online advertising started running in 2021 to recruit new drivers into the industry as well as provide Entry Level Driver Training. The campaign will continue through spring 2022.

AGC of SD celebrated Careers in Construction Month by hosting four construction camps in Aberdeen, Pierre, Sioux Falls and Yankton. The camps provided an inspiring hands-on experience for the over 465 students who attended and gave them the opportunity to network with industry professionals who shared why the construction industry is a great place to be. Thank you members for your support!

The HR Alliance was active in 2021 hosting monthly meetings. This year the networking group met to discuss topics pertinent to the construction industry such as: HR Law, Drug & Alcohol Clearinghouse, Driver Qualification File (DQF), Employer Filing Questions, AGC of America Resources and much more! The HR

Alliance has established itself as a consistent and critical way for AGC HR professionals to connect and is a great networking tool.

In 2021 AGC went into overdrive to stay on top of the evolving Marijuana Legalization in our state. We assisted members by providing them with valuable resources and legal expertise. AGC hosted a special session with attorney David Kroon of Woods, Fuller, Schultz & Smith at the State Convention to address the recent approval of medical marijuana. The presentation provided guidance for the verbiage needing to be placed in the company manuals of all AGC members.



AGC's innovative Construction Career Academy was a success in summer 2021. Seven students in Sioux Falls

and five students in Rapid City completed the program. This was the inaugural year in Rapid City. The Construction Career Academy is a ten-week program that blends technical college education with on-the-job work experience for a sponsoring AGC member company. Members have the opportunity to create long-term relationships with the students, which is an excellent way to start developing a high school talent pipeline! Applications open in January, so consider getting your company involved.

INDUSTRY LEADER

Our industry relationships ensure the construction industry remains at the forefront of key discussions!


In spring 2021, AGC & SDDOT hosted the **2021 Construction Industry Summit** virtually for the first-time ever. Over 100 attendees participated in the two-day event and great discussion was had by all.

AGC/MDU and **SD One Call** hosted a **Contractors Forum** in late April in Rapid City. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss MDU's new approach to utility line hits and how the changes affect contractors.



After the pandemic induced pause in 2020, the Annual AGC/Corps of Engineers Meeting resumed in Omaha, NE in early May. This two-day meeting has been an annual event since approximately 1984. Thirty-nine contractors from across the region attended this event - which is the highest attendance ever!

AGC members and staff were unable to meet with our **Congressional Delegation** in **Washington**, **D.C.** in 2021. However, an open line of communication was in place throughout the year on issues such as: mask mandates, supply chain and material shortages, and the Infrastructure Bill.







ADVOCACY

Why do we wade through hundreds of bills, spend 37 long days in the capitol, build relationships with 105 legislators and countless lobbyists, and add to the hot air by testifying in committees? It boils down to this: AGC fully engages in the legislative process to protect and advance the construction industry in South Dakota.

AGC of SD HHU's efforts at the 2021 Legislative Session were about money, marijuana and COVID. AGC was able to:

- Secure nearly \$10 million in federal COVID relief money for township and country road and bridge projects.
- Ensure Ellsworth Air Force base secured the new bomber mission as part of a team that helped secure \$10 million to build a recreation center. The new bomber mission will bring billions of dollars in development to South Dakota.
- Defend employers from frivolous COVID lawsuits by helping to pass a law.



- Stand up for employers' rights as South Dakota implements medical marijuana, by supporting a bill prohibiting marijuana use while driving.
- Set the stage to capture electric vehicle user fees by helping to pass the first license fee bill for e-cars.

AGC of SD had some fun along the way. Due to COVID restrictions, we were unable to host our annual Legislaive dinner, instead we hosted our first-ever legislative lunch in the Capitol Rotunda. It was a successful event we plan on continuing each year.



AGC of SD's success is driven by our members, who make the Contractors Political Action Committee (CONPAC) one of the most active and effective

PACs in South Dakota! Our members also lean into the political process and use the relationships built with our CONPAC program to reach out and influence construction-friendly legislation.

The Rapid City Chapter hosted a community project in April at the Star of the West Softball Complex as their first event of the year. YC members came together and demolished four dugout roofs at the complex for future replacement. In May, the chapter hosted a corn-hole tournament for members to socialize and work on team building.

The Sioux Falls Chapter of AGC's Young Constructors hosted their 2021 kick-off meeting & social in March at Great Shots. The event was very well attended and during the event several community project ideas were discussed, as well as setting their upcoming meetings/socials.

Both Chapters were busy during the summer months. In June, the Rapid City Chapter hosted their 2nd annual YC Golf Tournament at Hart Ranch and in July, members and their spouses/significant others rode a chairlift to the top of the mountain at Black Hills Tramway for dinner followed by a fun-filled alpine slide ride.

The Sioux Falls Chapter hosted a successful
